

## Regarding taking classes conducted remotely

For undergraduate students, the number of credits that can be earned through courses conducted in remote formats (i.e., online or on-demand classes; hereafter referred to as “remote courses”) and counted toward the graduation requirements is limited to 60 credits when the total number of credits required for graduation is 124.

If the graduation requirements exceed 124 credits, the excess number of credits may be added to the limit; therefore, the maximum number of credits permitted from remote courses in each department is as shown below.

Civil Engineering and Architecture	at least 133 credits	Up to 69 credits
Chemistry and Biotechnology, Chemistry Program	at least 134 credits	Up to 70 credits
Electrical Engineering, Electronics, and Information Engineering, Automotive Engineering Program	at least 138.5 credits	Up to 74.5 credits
Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering, Automotive Engineering Program	at least 137 credits	Up to 73 credits

Caution: For students enrolled prior to the AY2025, the number of credits required for graduation may differ from the above.

In this case, the maximum number of credits for Remote courses is calculated as (credits required for graduation - 124 credits) + 60 credits.

Remote courses are indicated on the NU Portal by “[Remote]” placed before the course title. In addition, the course delivery format can be confirmed in the syllabus for each course on the NU Portal.

You can also check the number of credits you have earned from remote courses so far through the Grade Report page on the NU Portal.

The curriculum of each department, including the liberal arts and sciences courses, is designed such that students will not exceed the upper limit of credits from remote courses as long as they complete the required courses in the standard manner.

However, if you earn credits from remote courses in excess of the maximum number permitted by your department, those credits cannot be counted toward the graduation requirements.

Therefore, please make sure to **(1) check whether a course you plan to register for is a remote course at the time of course registration,** and **(2) regularly confirm the number of credits you have earned from remote courses.**

Remote courses include not only those in which all class sessions are conducted online or on-demand, but also those in which some sessions (not exceeding half of the total number of class meetings) are conducted in person.

<Notes>

\*For students who enrolled in or before AY2022: Credits earned from remote courses completed by AY2022 are not included in the above limit on credits from remote courses, as a special measure related to COVID-19. However, credits earned from remote courses taken in AY2023 or later will be counted toward the limit.

\*For students who have difficulty commuting to campus due to an underlying medical condition: if, as an educational accommodation, a student is permitted to attend an in-person course remotely on an individual basis, such a course will not be counted as a remote course.
